Village of Poplar Grove Dog Park Rules and Tag Fees

- Residents- 20.00 for the first dog \$5.00 for each dog after. Non-Residents \$25.00 for the first dog and \$10.00 for each dog after.
- Must be registered with Boone County Health Department. Proof of registration is required at the time of application.
- Open Daily from Sunrise to Sunset.
- Users of the facility do so at their own risk. The Village of Poplar Grove is not responsible for any injury or damage caused by any dog or handler in the Dog Park.
- Dogs are permitted off- leash within the enclosed fenced are only.
- Dogs should not be left unattended.
- The Dog Park is strictly for DOGS ONLY!
- Owners are required to pick-up after their dog(s).
- Dogs are prohibited in the park if under the age of 6 month, or a female "in-heat".
- Dogs must be always accompanied by an adult 18 years and older.
- Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and leaving the park. Owners must always carry leash.
- Gates must be kept closed at all times.
- No Smoking, alcohol, glass, or food allowed.
- All objects use for dogs such as tennis balls, frisbees and other dog toys must be removed when leaving the Dog Park. The Village of Poplar Grove reserves the right to discard any such objects left behind.
- The Park may be closed periodically to allow turf to recover, especially after heavy rain or wintertime use.
- Dogs with a known history of dangerous behavior toward people of other dogs are prohibited from the dog park.
- The Village of Poplar Grove reserves the right to suspend or revoke dog park privilege to any member who fails to follow park rules, in addition to, the Village of Poplar Grove has determined a member dog or dog owner/handler is dangerous to others or is in violation of any applicable animal ordinance or regulations.
- In the event of a dog bite or other injury, each user who is involved, either on their own or through their dog(s), shall exchange tag and other reasonably-required information such as name, telephone number and address.
- Please be courteous, treat other the way you want them to treat you and your dog.
